Code of Conduct

The following **Codes of Behaviour** have been adopted by the Yamba SLSC Junior Activities Committee (Nippers). **By joining Yamba SLSC Junior Activities - each Nipper, Parent or Caregiver acknowledges and accepts these Codes of Conduct.**

Parents, Caregivers & Spectators Code of Behaviour

- Children participate in sport for their own enjoyment and development.
- Encourage and praise children for participation and effort.
- Encourage children to always play by the rules.
- Remember children learn best by example.
- Appreciate good performances and skilful play by **all** participants, to promote good sportsmanship.
- Respect officials, age managers and coaches' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for age managers, administrators, coaches and officials.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- If you disagree with any decisions of the Nippers team, raise the issue through the Nippers supervisor. Do not question the volunteer's judgement and honesty in public.

Nippers' Code of Behaviour –

- Participate for your own enjoyment and benefit.
- Respect our clubhouse and the equipment you use, wash it and return it after use and report any damage.
- Treat all participants as you would like to be treated yourself. Do not bully, put other people down or take unfair advantage of another nipper.
- Co-operate with your age managers, water safety officers, teammates, coaches, officials and opponents.
- Wear your nipper cap at all times during nippers and wear pink singlets for water activities.
- Be a good sport and applaud all performances; encourage others.

Nipper of the Week

Each Sunday during Nippers activities, the Age Managers choose one member who has participated well, and exhibited good sportsmanship and co-operation, for the 'Nipper of the Week' award.

Photography

Conforming to SLSA policy and the Australian Sports Commission, Yamba SLSC will ensure that a high level of care is exercised with photographic images, particularly with junior members.

The Nippers Program

Who can Join Yamba Nippers?

In 2025/2026, Yamba Nippers is from Under 7's to Under 14's. Children must turn 6 on or before the 30th of September 2025, to join the Under 7's. All other age groups are determined by their age on the 30th September 2025.

TO JOIN:

NEW members (i.e. those who haven't been a member of ANY surf club before):

- Go ONLINE to join.sls.com.au
- Follow instructions to join 'a family'. **Join the adult first, then create a family group** when prompted, to add additional family members and nippers
- Complete the details required for each member to **APPLY** and then **MAKE PAYMENT**.

EXISTING surf club members:

- Go ONLINE to hub.sls.com.au
- Login with your existing Username
- Go to Memberships, Family, Renew and click the members to renew
- Complete for each family member and ADD new members if needed

This **renewal process** for each individual member is to be completed each year.

Nipper Days

Nippers is held at Main Beach Yamba, although if conditions do not allow, we will consider moving to a more suitable location. Any Nipper information for the coming Sunday will be sent out via text and posted on the 'Nippers Yamba Surf Club- Members Only' Facebook page.

What does a Sunday at Nippers look like?

- 8.00am- Beach Set Up by rostered age group. Age managers will let parents know of their turn.
- 8.45am- Arrive for sign on. All Nippers must sign on with their Age Manager
- 9.00am- Activities commence.
- 10.30am- Activities cease, Nippers to sign off.
- 10.30am- Sausage sizzle most Sundays
- 11.30am- Yamba SLSC Handicap swim race.

Activities on the day are both beach and water based. There is an education component that Nippers will complete over the first half of the season. To obtain their relevant Surf Safe Certificate at season end Nippers **MUST** complete their education component.

Weather Cancellation

Cancellation of Nippers or carnivals will be communicated via the following;

- A text message sent to your mobile number as listed on your registration. It is important to keep your details up to date.
- A post on "Yamba Nippers 25/26 - Members Only" Facebook group.

What to Bring

- coloured nipper cap
- pink hi-viz singlet
- goggles
- sunscreen
- water bottle
- towel, and
- sun protection clothing and hat.

Skull Cap Policy

- All nippers must wear their coloured skull caps at all times during nippers.
- Skull caps are to be removed once Nippers has finished for the day.
- The wearing of skull caps is a requirement to comply with Surf Life Saving safety regulations.
- Yamba's gold and black skull caps must be worn whilst competing at all surf carnivals.

High Visibility Singlets

All nippers who participate in water activities will be given a Yamba Surf Club high visibility singlet free of charge.

- It is Yamba Nippers policy that high visibility singlets are mandatory for Nippers participating in all water activities.
- Children will not be allowed to participate in water events if they do not have their singlet on. You can sometimes find spares in the equipment room if you've forgotten one.

Swimwear is available for purchase most Sunday mornings at the clubhouse or from the club office during office hours.

Carnivals

Throughout the season there are multiple carnivals. Whilst we encourage all nippers to compete, carnival attendance is not compulsory. As a general rule the carnivals are as follows:

- Far North Coast Branch carnivals – held at beaches between Fingal and Yamba (including Yamba's home carnival)
- Far North Coast Branch Championship Carnival- at a selected venue in the FNC Branch
- NSW Country Championships - hosted at a selected venue north of Newcastle or south of Wollongong
- NSW State Age Championships- hosted at a selected venue usually in Sydney or surrounds

All nippers from U8s and up can compete at carnivals.

Equipment

Yamba SLSC supplies all equipment needed for Sunday activities and Carnivals, including Nipper Boards. As we are a club funded by donations and sponsors, it is important we all take responsibility for the handling, care and returning of all equipment.

Boards

Boards are available for use by club members only. Boards can be used during Nippers Sunday activities and other times when the board shed is open (most patrolled weekends). If you use the boards, it is your responsibility to care for them and return them to the board shed after each use.

- Do not leave boards lying on the beach in the sun for extended periods
- Do not sit on boards on the sand
- Lift and carry boards, do not drag them across the sand
- Wash boards after use with fresh water, supplied at the board shed
- Report any damage to Yamba SLSC.

Surf Education

Surf Life Saving Surf Education Program (Surf Ed)

The 'Surf Ed' program is an integral part of our Junior Activity Program. The program is based on a clearly defined structure and outcomes established by SLSA to aid the children's lifesaving development. The surf education components must be completed by December 31st, each season.

All nippers are able to gain their respective Surf Ed award for their age group during the season, subject to a minimum number of attendances prior to December 31st. Listed below is a summary of the awards for each age group.

- U7 Surf Play Two
- U8 Surf Aware One
- U9 Surf Aware Two
- U10 Surf Safe One
- U11 Surf Safe Two
- U12 Surf Smart One
- U13 Surf Smart Two
- U14 Surf Rescue Certificate

Resuscitation Certificate

Candidates for the Resuscitation Certificate course need to be 11 years or older. At Yamba Nippers, the Under 12 age group completes this training each season. This training will be conducted in the latter half of the season. Upon completion, Nippers are awarded Surf Life Saving accreditation in Resuscitation which becomes a part of their future skill set when training for the SRC and toward joining the volunteer lifesaving service.

Surf Rescue Certificate - SRC

Candidates for this course need to be 13 years or older and are training to become patrolling members. U/14 Nippers train for their SRC on Sunday mornings during Oct/Nov and are assessed in early December. They are then allocated to a senior patrol team for the second half of the season.

Junior Group Evaluations (Proficiency)

Surf Lifesaving Australia sets the minimum standards of water proficiency that each child **must** attain before being eligible to participate in club water activities, training or competition. Prior to commencement of the Nippers water-based activities, the Junior **Preliminary** Evaluation skills must be attained.

In addition, Junior **Competition** Evaluations are completed to ensure all nippers who wish to compete at carnivals have sufficient ability, strength and fitness.

Surf Carnivals

Summary and Surf Carnival Day Information

- Yamba Surf Club is part of the **Far North Coast Branch** of Surf Lifesaving which runs from Yamba to Fingal near the Qld border.
- **The U8 to U14** nippers are able to compete at carnival level. **Notice of competing in a carnival must be given to the JAC Coordinator the Sunday prior to the carnival.** You cannot just turn up at a carnival.
- Nippers must participate in their **Surf Education Award** by attending a minimum **66%** of regular nipper activity days to be eligible to compete at carnivals.
- Competitors must have passed the relevant **Competitions Skills Proficiency** before they can attend a carnival.
- Branch carnivals usually begin at **8.30am** and finish around **4pm**. Parental assistance is required at Carnivals. Help is needed to erect and take down tents, carry gear from our gear trailer to the beach and return at the end of the day.
- There is a **ratio of competitors to water safety and officials**. Courses are available for these roles and are usually quite easy – half day sessions.
- **Yamba SLSC competition caps and Yamba club swimmers MUST be worn while competing.** Pink Hi-Viz singlets are required for water events. No jewellery to be worn at any time.
- Parents, unless performing in uniform as officials, are NOT permitted in the competition arena.
- The JAC Co-ordinator or Team Manager is the only person from our Club eligible to lodge a **protest** regarding any alleged infringement of the rules.
- The Carnival is under the direction of the Carnival Referee. The Referee can alter or even cancel a program if adverse surf, beach or weather conditions prevail, please stay contactable and keep an eye on our Facebook page for updates.
- No Alcohol and no Smoking is permitted within the Carnival area.
- Code of conduct applies, and breaches may result in team penalties occurring.

Yamba Club Championship Days

Club Championship Days are about friendly in-house competition on Main Beach. **All age groups and abilities participate** in some serious and not so serious events. Details and dates of these will be advised through the season.

Nipper Competition Events

Individuals

- WADE RACE - (U/8) - Competitors sprint from the start line into the water and wade around a set course.
- SURF RACE- (U/9-U/14) - Competitors sprint from the start line into the surf and swim around a set of buoys and return to shore.
- BOARD RACE - (U/9-U/14)- Paddling a board from the beach, out through the break, around a set of buoys and back to shore.
- IRONMAN/WOMAN - (U/11-U/14) – Swim, board and run. The order is swim leg followed by board leg.
- BEACH FLAGS - lying flat on the sand, then getting up and running a short distance to grasp lengths of hose standing in the sand. The event is run over a number of rounds with a child eliminated each round until there is an eventual winner.
- BEACH SPRINT - Run either 50m (U/8) or 70m (U/9 -14) on the beach track.

Teams

- MARCH PAST - Teams of 12 are judged on their ability to march around the main carnival area. This event is steeped in tradition as it was initially designed as an event for clubs to parade in their colours.
- CAMERON RELAY - (U/11-U/14) JNR/SNR- Team 4 members: 1 swimmer, 2 runners, and a board paddler.
- BOARD RESCUE - (U/11-U/14)-JNR/SNR- Team consists of 2 competitors, a swimmer and a board paddler. Swimmer swims to the buoys and signals the board paddler to rescue him. Both return to beach on the board and run to the finish line both holding the board.
- ALL AGE BEACH RELAY - (U/8-U/14) – A beach event with 7 team members, 1 from each age - youngest to oldest.
- SWIM TEAMS - (U/9-U/14) – Competitors (4 per team) sprint from the start line into the surf and swim around a set of buoys and return to shore.
- WADE RELAY - (U/8) – Competitors (3 per team) sprint from the start line into the water and wade around a set course.
- BOARD RELAY - (U/9-U/14) - a relay team of 3, individually paddle around the course and sprint to tag their teammate.
- BEACH RELAY - Team of 4, individually run the set track to pass the baton to their teammate.
- BUCHANAN RELAY – 4 U/8s (3 runners, 1 wader), 1 U/9 and 1 U/10(for board and swim legs).

Nipper Club Awards

Age Championship Point Score

1 male and 1 female champion and runner-up from each competition age group (U8's-U14's) is awarded a trophy at the end of the season. This is determined by the following point system.

- 3 points are awarded for participation on a recognised Nippers Activity Day. Any child representing Yamba SLSC at an SLSA recognised Carnival or events on days that clash with Nipper Days will be awarded the 3 participation points in addition to carnival points gained on the day.
- 1 point will be awarded for attendance at Far North Coast Branch JAC Carnivals, Country and State Championships, plus 1 point for participation in each individual event. Nippers who achieve a top 6 finish will be awarded points reflective of their finish, e.g. first place 6 points, second place 5 points etc. When a Nipper declines to attend a Carnival, 1 point only will be awarded upon attendance at alternate activities if available.
- Club Championship Day/s: Placing in individual races will earn the following points –First 6, Second 5, Third 4, Fourth 3, Fifth 2 and all other entrants completing the event – 1 point.

Nipper Major Perpetual Awards

Competition Awards

Alyce Bennett Award

Awarded to the Nipper with the combination of the highest points/placings for **water events** at Carnivals (taking into account Club Championship and attendance).

Des Eamens Memorial Award

Awarded to the Nipper with the combination of the highest points/placings for **beach events** at Carnivals (taking into account Club Championship and attendance).

Jacob Lollback Memorial Award - Junior Club Champion

Awarded to the Nipper with the highest overall combination of carnival results (taking into account Club Championship and attendance).

Senior Nipper Awards

Jack Goddard Memorial Award (Junior Lifesaver)

Awarded to a senior Nipper, U12 and up, who has a broad concept of all aspects of lifesaving and has a great attendance and participation record. Nominations will be decided and awarded by Nipper Committee & Age Managers.

John Muggleton Award (Junior Club Person)

Awarded to a senior Nipper, U12 and up, who has active participation at all times through regular Nippers, training and carnival participation; is a good role model and active helper for younger nippers; is active in other tasks associated with the general running of nippers and surf club activities.

Parents may enquire about their child's point score up until 13th December 2024.

CHILD SAFE COMMITMENT STATEMENT

Yamba SLSC:

- is committed to the safety and wellbeing of every child and young person who takes part in our activities, programs, events or services
- is committed to providing children and young people with a positive and nurturing experience
- will support families and the community to promote the healthy development and wellbeing of all children
- will strive to ensure that children and young people are protected from abuse and harm
- will work to create an environment in which children and young people are safe and feel safe at all times
- will listen to children and young people and address any concerns that they raise with us
- will support our members and the community to report any suspicion, or concern in relation to the mistreatment, or potential mistreatment of a child or young person and
- will challenge inappropriate behaviour of any of its members or members of the community
- will ensure all children and young people, no matter what cultural ethnicity, language, religion or disability, shall be able to participate in surf lifesaving in a fun and safe environment.
- will appoint a Member Protection Information Officer, or equivalent, and ensure this person is trained on the obligations and responsibilities with respect to safeguarding children and young people
- will strive to ensure that persons in a position of authority do not harm, abuse or exploit children or young people who are involved within our club
- may not ask for consent to disclose information to police or an external child protection agency in the event we have concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child or young person.

As part of our commitment to keeping children and young people safe, our club:

- is committed to supporting parents and carers to protect their children and young people
- will offer assistance that builds on a family's strengths and make up, is sensitive to their culture and religious beliefs and empowers them to meet the changing needs of their children and young people
- is committed to communicating honestly and openly with parents and carers about the wellbeing and safety of their children and young people
- will promote and distribute information to parents and carers about our child safe commitment to children and young people as part of an introduction to our club
- endeavours to be transparent in our decision-making, with parents and carers, so long as doing so does not compromise the safety of a child/young person or breach the SLSC Privacy Policy.
